Advanced Placement and Dual Enrollment Courses Prepare Students for College

The Social Studies Department offers two advanced placement courses and four dual enrollment courses. Advanced Placement courses follow the College Board curriculum and prepare students at AAHS to take the national AP exams scheduled in May 2014. Many colleges award credit for earning a particular score on the exam. The AP Psychology exam is on May 5 and the AP United States Government and Politics exam will be held on Tuesday, May 13, 2014. All exams are administered through the guidance department and held at AAHS.

AAHS and Keystone College partner to

offer dual enrollment courses for our high school students. Students have the opportunity to earn three college credits for the following courses:

AP United States Government and Politics (American National Government)
AP Psychology
(Introduction to Psychology)
Principles of Society
(Introduction to Society/Sociology)
Microeconomics
(Principles of Economics I)

Last year 2012-2013 the History Club at Athens was first organized and developed for the students. As a Social Studies teacher at Athens High School for the past ten years I was ecstatic when a group of freshmen came to me with the idea of a history club. Working with my students we have been able to organize the club, provoke student interest, and begin our year study of a historical time period of their choice. For this school year the students have decided to focus their historical attention on the years of the Cold War. Students ranging from the 9th-12th grades have dedicated their time with discussions, research, and a book study to become more familiar with the time.
